Practice Music App

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






Our experience of this app:

On opening this app we are given the choice to sign in as a student or a teacher. As we are curious to know what advice they will be giving to each party, and how it will differ, we will be trying out both!

At this point, the App crashed and shut. After opening the app back up, we are told this was to be expected if 'Auto-Lock' has not been turned off in Settings-General. The voice of skepticism has entered my head again ... why should this be necessary?

After multiple attempts to sign-up and/or log in, we gave up ... clearly an app with a few teething issues, we would not recommend you waste your precious time!!
